Celebrating Rotorua Lakes and fishery.

There are 16 lakes in the Rotorua region, 15 are fishable lakes of varying sizes and depth. The stock is predominately rainbow trout, with rainbow trout plus some brook and tiger trout present. All lakes are easily accessible by car and most can be fished from the shoreline and by wading, however a small boat opens up much more fishing opportunity. Major fishing lakes are Rotorua, Rotoiti, Tarawera, Okataina, and Rotoma. All lakes are open 365 days except for some gazetted areas on Tarawera, Rotoiti, and Okataina. These trophy lakes are closed to boat fishing over the winter period (1 July to 30 September) though certain shoreline areas remain open to land based angling year round. Talk to staff at any of the local tackle stores for information about access, regulations, and tackle advice, or visit the Eastern Region Fish & Game website https://fishandgame.org.nz/eastern/


